The Professional Mastery of Office Technology for Employment (ProMOTE) training program is a qualifying program to address the growing need for qualified Assistive Technology (AT) professionals who can provide superior instruction on Adaptive Technology and Information Technology to persons with vision impairments in a group environment. The train the trainer program is not for the faint of heart, with only 10 instructors making it into the program, Jan Lynch is the sole representative from the state of Texas. Applying for the training program was a 2-step process with applications, resume, sample material, testimonials, classroom instruction samples, software knowledge and teaching techniques being gathered and evaluated by NIB. The training program will take place March 26-31, 2017 at NIB headquarters in Alexandria, Virginia.

Once complete, Jan and her staff will be prepared to teach the ProMOTE course to up to seven clients at a time once back in East Texas. The course schedule for clients will consist of 8 hours a day, 5 days a week, four weeks providing individuals with the tools they need to accelerate their future employment in a more expedient fashion. The goal of this instruction is to ensure students are ready for the rigors and pacing of the modern workplace, enabling them the opportunity to enhance their skills for upward mobility and career opportunities.
